Important issues such as health, education, access to employment and race equality remain key to realising the unlocked potential within Gypsy and Traveller communities. Figures by the Equality and Human Rights Commission indicate a life expectancy 10 years lower than the national average, with similar inequality found amongst health and education outcomes. Understanding the barriers faced by Gypsy and Traveller communities is key to improving life outcomes and tackling ongoing inequality.

As well as looking at the impact of the Localism Act, other legislation and new policies, delegates will have the opportunity to hear best practice examples on tackling stereotypes, dealing with conflict and engaging with Gypsy and Traveller communities to deliver vital services. Now in its 10th year, this is the national conference for all those working in Gypsy and Traveller services to explore emerging trends, hear the latest policy and share best practice.


